- Feather tickling - you'll both have great fun as your kitten tries to catch the feather (just watch out for those sharp little claws!)
- Feline fishing - your kitten will love chasing anything tied to a piece of string; pull it away from her and just watch her pounce!
- Perfect pouncing - a cardboard tube will give you and your kitten endless entertainment, especially if something pops out of the end!

During playtime, don't forget to let your kitten win every few rounds. If you don't, she'll get quickly frustrated that she can't satisfy her natural hunting instincts.
